What's Included...

In Basic Code 1, Level 1, each lesson covers one Basic Code Sound Picture.¹

The typical Kindergarten year covers one lesson per week, for a total of 25 weeks of instruction. That means the typical student learns one Sound Picture a week. But based on your student's individual abilities, your student can move through the lessons at any comfortable pace. Simply match the learning timeline to exactly what your child needs!

Lessons are cumulative—so each lesson builds upon the lesson that came before. Here, your student gets everything needed for early language learning, including...

- ✓ Reading
- ✓ Spelling
- ✓ Beginning Handwriting (learning how to "draw the Sound Pictures")
- ✓ Vocabulary (learning and using new words)
- ✓ Beginning sentence structure (how to put ideas together for speaking and writing)
- ✓ Reading comprehension (strategies for remembering what was read)
- ✓ Critical thinking (thinking about reading and writing)

For all of the subjects above, nothing else needs to be purchased.

The Lesson Key

Each lesson begins with a *Lesson Key* on the first page of the lesson. To download and print the Key, simply click on the yellow button. Keys for each lesson can be accessed "as you go," or you can download, print, and save all of the Keys in a binder before you begin.

How the Lesson Key Works...

The Lesson Key is your how-to checklist for what to do within the lesson. Simply follow the order of activities, using the check-off boxes to keep track of your student's progress. You can also keep notes in the margins (or the backside of the page) as to what was easy, what was a challenge, and what you'd like to repeat, to master the learning.

Three Types of Learning in Each Lesson

You'll find three types of learning activities in each lesson: 1) videos, 2) hands-on activities, and 3) games.

¹ A *Sound Picture* is one or more letters representing a sound (such as /a/ or /v/) or group of sounds (such as /qu/, which is a two-sound Sound Picture). Videos

Videos are labeled PARENT/TEACHER VIDEO (how-to videos, or helps for teaching) and STUDENT VIDEO (to be watched by the student). **Hands-on activities** include completing interactive pages with manipulates, and **games** include crafts; games played independently; and games played with a parent, teacher, or older sibling.

Parent/Teacher Led Content

Parents and teachers, you're the guide navigating the content. Students watch videos, complete activities, and play the games with you and/or siblings and friends.

Because of the need for how-to instructions at the start, the first lessons have a few more videos than the following lessons. Written and video instructions for already-learned activities and games are "dropped off" the around the fourth lesson. To find the how-to videos and instructions again, go to the first lessons, or visit the Basic Code Level 1 Home Page and click on the "Before You Begin" yellow button.

Supplies

At the beginning of each Lesson Key, you'll find a list of the week's supplies. Supplies are also listed within the lesson (in the tab areas). Downloadable pages are always paired with hands-on activities and manipulative pieces.

Downloadable Activity Pages

Pages are found within the tabbed sections. Simply click on the red button, to download the pages.

Game Instructions

Instructions can be on video or on downloadable pages. To learn how to play a game, simply read the instructions and/or watch the how-to video.

Working through the Lesson

Lesson activities are divided into the singular, simple task, subset skills of reading and spelling—so your child can master each and every part of reading and spelling with ease. Simply follow the tabs from left to right, to complete the content in order.

Everything is "done for you" – there's nothing else that you need to purchase. You have all that you need here, to teach your child with confidence.
